Quick notes on wet snow "stability"

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In my videos I have somewhat implied that slopes are "stable" while they have a solid melt-freeze crust, but that is only in regards to wet snow. This evening I was wondering if a (mostly dry) avalanche could be triggered multiple feet deep on the pwl on a slope with a 1-2" frozen crust on the surface? Seems possible, especially this year. (Maybe the crust would make triggering slightly more difficult, but promote <u>propagation</u>?) Then Nelson's observation came in and it sounds like he had a large <u>collapse</u> a couple feet deep on a slope with a frozen crust on the surface...

I just wanted to urge us to be cautious saying or writing, "slopes with a frozen surface are good to go", despite what I may have said in a video. A frozen surface cab rule out the wet snow danger, but you still have to assess the potential for avalanches to break on deeper buried weak layers.

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
